
Foundations for Partnership and Collaboration

California Budget 2024 - 2025 & K-12 Omnibus Trailer Bill

On June 29, 2024, the <u>California Budget</u> was signed, securing the substantial investments in funding for California's Expanded Learning Programs. The ASES and 21st CCLC rates remained the same, and the ELO Program funding remained at \$4B.

With a new budget year, also comes new legislative changes, through the <u>K-12 Omnibus Trailer Bill</u> to the established Education Code. Some of these changes will impact Expanded Learning in the current fiscal year, and in future years:

- ELO Program Funding Expenditure Timeline, funds must be expended within two fiscal years or returned
- Legislative intent to establish Rate 2 at \$2,000 minimum per UP pupil; as long as funds are available
- Continuing the annual TK/K reporting
- Conjunction with Attendance Recovery starting in FY 2025-26
- Declaration of Operational Intent starting in FY 2025-26

All legislative changes will be reflected in the updated Program Requirements Matrix.

Expanded Learning Expenditure Deadline of September 30, 2024

ELO Program: All unexpended funds from FY 21-22 & FY 22-23 need to be expended by 9/30 or returned to the state. Additionally, the CDE Expenditure Report, where LEAs will indicate how they spent their money, will be due by October 30, 2024.

ASES & 21st CCLC: All FY 23-24 funds must be expensed or encumbered by the end of Quarter 5, 9/30.

ASES and 21st CCLC Attendance Reporting and Reductions

Reminder! The ASES and 21st CCLC Attendance Reductions are in place for Calendar Year 2024. For more information, review the <u>CDE-EXLD email</u> regarding the grant reduction process.

Other Legislative Impacts on Expanded Learning

- LEAs <u>will not be required</u> to go through the initial identification: English language proficiency assessment for TK students. This may impact the LEAs overall unduplicated pupil percentage (UPP) (AB 2268).
- AB-2112 Muratsuchi Bill: the ELO Program Stakeholder Working Group has been put in the suspense file
- AB-1113 McCarty Bill: the ELO Program Data System has been moved to a third reading
- <u>AB-153 K-12 Omnibus Trailer Bill</u>: 46210 Attendance Recovery beginning FY 2025-26



A Three-Tiered Approach for Technical Assistance

Providing Equitable Access to Implement High Quality Expanded Learning Programs

The ELTAU serves 74 districts, and 272 charters in Los Angeles County who are providing Expanded Learning programs and experiences to over 537K students daily. As the regional agency solely charged with assisting Local Education Agencies (LEAs) and Grantees, the ELTAU implements a Technical Assistance ideology that is grounded in a three-tiered approach for Technical Assistance.




Technical Assistance Strategies

ELTAU's Six Strategies for Technical Assistance

The ELTAU uses the following six strategies to provide equitable access to ongoing, needs-driven services that support LEAs and Grantees in creating and implementing effective and quality Expanded Learning Programs in Region 11. The <u>Quality Standards for Expanded Learning in California</u> are also used as a framework to determine the quality of a program at the programmatic, staff, and participant levels and to complement other standards in the State of California.

An Interconnected System in Expanded Learning



EXPANDED LEARNING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE UNIT

The ELTAU offers Technical Assistance to certificated and classified Expanded Learning leaders at School Districts, Charter Schools, Community Based Organizations and Cities. These positions/roles include:

- Administrators/Grant Managers
- Program Directors
- Site Coordinators
- Frontline Staff

Administrator/Grant Manager: The individual(s) from a district, charter, county, city, or community-based organization who is ultimately responsible for the overall direction of the Expanded Learning Program, including but not limited to: grant oversight, operations, overall program direction, and ensuring grant compliance and certified assurances are met.

Other titles associated with this role can include: District Level Administrators, Executive Personnel, Site Level Administrators, or Agency Directors.

Program Director: The individual(s) responsible for the training and implementation of the developed Expanded Learning program policies and practices across the agency, as well as the oversite of two or more site-based programs and who may evaluate staff.


Other titles associated with this role can include Regional Manager, Regional Supervisor, Traveling Supervisor, or Quality Assurance Coach.

Site Coordinator: The individual(s) who oversees the implementation of Expanded Learning program policies and practices at one site and has responsibility for the supervision of the frontline staff. *Other titles associated with this role can include Site Manager, Site Lead, or Site Supervisor.*

Frontline Staff: The individual(s) responsible for direct service such as student supervision, engagement, and program delivery.




